

Joe Khan – PA Attorney General

Joe Khan is a dad, son of an immigrant, and a former local and federal prosecutor who has dedicated his life to fighting on behalf of regular Pennsylvanians and their families. He and his brother, State Representative Tarik Khan, grew up in Northeast Philadelphia.

Joe previously served for a decade as an Assistant U.S. Attorney for the Eastern District of Pennsylvania, where he resolved highstakes matters across southeastern Pennsylvania, including

leading the historic City Hall corruption probes in Allentown and Reading and the prosecution of the largest Ponzi scheme ever committed in Delaware County. Since beginning his career prosecuting sexual assault, child abuse, and domestic violence in the Philadelphia District Attorney's Office, his work and commentary have been featured often in national and local media.

More recently, Joe served as the Solicitor for Bucks County, where he was credited with "redefining the role of County Solicitor." In addition to overseeing all litigation for the County, Joe built partnerships with other public entities to protect consumers, and the environment through innovative litigation, including the first lawsuit of its kind against social media companies for fueling a youth mental health crisis. Joe also played an instrumental role in protecting Pennsylvanian's voting rights when he defeated Trump's lawyers' efforts to throw out votes in Bucks County and led a multi-county effort to defeat similar efforts throughout the Commonwealth.

During his tenure with Bucks County, the Pennsylvania Bar Association recognized him as 2022's Government Lawyer of the Year and the County Commissioners Association of Pennsylvania honored him with the Outstanding Solicitor Award.

Joe is a public school graduate who earned degrees from Swarthmore College and the University of Chicago Law School. He has led several nonprofit boards, has served on the Pennsylvania Governor's Advisory Commission for Asian Pacific American Affairs, and is now a parent volunteer in the Central Bucks School District.
